Latest Updates:

Local:

- Bobcat Fire Update: Due to high winds and red flag warnings, residents in the foothill communities of the San Gabriel Mountains may see ash or dust. The fire is 95% contained and poses no immediate threat.
- As of today, the California Secretary of State has reported 7,152,353+ vote by mail ballots have been cast.
- According to Southern California Edison, during a power outage there are seven ways to keep your phone charged.
 - Charge with your laptop by plugging it in your laptop's USB port.
 - Charge with your car battery by using the USB charging ports.
 - Use a Solar-Powered Charger
 - Use a Hand-Crank Charger
 - Use an external battery pack
 - Conserve your phone's power by putting your phone on airplane mode, lowering your screen's brightness and turning off background applications
 - o Visit Community Crew Vehicles: SCE dispatches community crew vehicles that provide charging ports where you can charge your mobile devices, grab some snacks and water.

County:

- The Los Angeles County Department of Public Heath revised the County Health Order on October 23, 2020. To view the revised County Health Order, click here. The order was revised to:
 - o permit batting cages, miniature golf, and go-cart racing for outside services;
 - o permit personal care establishments to offer services indoors with modifications;
 - o clarify permitted food services at indoor malls and shopping centers;
 - o increase the percentage of students with IEPs and ELs and other high-need students allowed at any one time on a K-12 campus from 10% to 25%; and
 - o permit schools to reopen TK-2ndgrades for classroom instruction only with a waiver application approved by Public Health.
- The County Health order has also revised Appendix I Protocol on wineries and breweries. To view the revisions click here.
- The National Weather Service Los Angeles is reporting strong Santa Ana winds through Tuesday 11p.m. in combination of single digit humidities and extremely dry vegetation.
- In response to strong Santa Ana winds, power outages may impact traffic signals. Motorists should use extreme caution and treat all intersection as four-way stops.
