## Latest Updates:

Local:

- During December through February, green waste can accumulate more than usual during the year. If your green cart has been full and does not fit anymore green waste, simply place them in bags (up to 10 bags) and call Waste Management to schedule a pick up at no extra cost. - Loma Vista Park is currently closed due to removing and replacing the playground starting December 1<sup>st</sup>. The park shelter and basketball court will remain open during construction. - With the latest County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health "Safer At Home Order", the City of San Dimas will temporarily suspend overnight parking restrictions effective Wednesday, December 2, 2020. The City will reassess the situation at the beginning of the new year and will provide the community an update at that time.

County:

- The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors recently approved "Keep LA County Dining Grant." Eligible businesses can receive \$30,000 for Working Capital Assistance. The application period will begin Thursday, December 3, 2020 at 12:00 am to Sunday, December 6, 2020 at 11:59 pm or until 2,500 applications are received, whichever comes first. - Dr. Christina Ghaly, announced that the Department of Human Services (DHS) will launch an at-home testing program to allow individuals of confirmed exposure, symptomatic, senior citizens and community members with disabilities that are not able to travel to a testing center. The program is set to run through January 15, 2021 and will begin within the next few days. To register, individuals should visit Los <u>Angeles County COVID website</u> to request an at home testing kit.
