City of San Dimas Office of the City Manager - Update March 31, 2020

Latest Updates:

- Governor Newsom signed an Executive Order to provide tax, regulatory, and licensing extensions for businesses
 - The Order allows the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration to offer a 90-day extension for tax returns and tax payments for all businesses filing a return for less than \$1 million in taxes. Small businesses will have until the end of July to file their first-quarter returns
 - o The Order extends the statute of limitations to file a claim for refund by 60 days to accommodate tax and fee payers
 - The Order also includes extensions that impact state government workers, as well as consumers; the DMV is limiting in-person transactions for the next 60 days and allowing for mail-in renewals; the Department of Consumer Affairs will waive continuing education requirements for several professions for the next 60 days

- Governor Newsom also announced the "Stay Home. Save Lives. Check In" campaign urging Californians to help combat social isolation and food insecurity among Californians who are over the age of 65
 - Californians are urged to check in on their older neighbors with a call, text or physically-distanced door knock to make sure they're ok
 - o He also announced a statewide hotline (833) 544-2374 as a one-stop-shop to answer questions and get assistance during this crisis
- San Dimas Farmers Market Opening Postponed
 - The City and the Advocates for Healthy Living organization are strategizing on how to continue to operate the Farmers Market (limited to only produce and food sales) while being mindful of the Federal and State recommended guidelines for social distancing and best practices to mitigate the risk of COVID-19 exposure
