Latest Updates:

- To help everyone check the status of their Economic Impact Payment, the IRS is launching a tool that will provide the status of a payment, including the date it's scheduled to be deposited or mailed

- Governor Gavin Newsom today unveiled six key indicators that will guide California's thinking for when and how to modify the stay-at-home and other orders during the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - o Until we are able to build immunity, actions will be aligned to achieve the following:
 - Ensure our ability to care for the sick within our hospitals;
 - Prevent infection in people who are at high risk for severe disease;
 - Build the capacity to protect the health and well-being of the public; and
 - Reduce social, emotional and economic disruptions
 - California's six indicators for modifying the stay-at-home order are:
 - The ability to monitor and protect our communities through testing, contact tracing, isolating, and supporting those who are positive or exposed;
 - The ability to prevent infection in people who are at risk for more severe COVID-19;
 - The ability of the hospital and health systems to handle surges;
 - The ability to develop therapeutics to meet the demand;
 - The ability for businesses, schools, and child care facilities to support physical distancing; and
 - The ability to determine when to reinstitute certain measures, such as the stay-at-home orders, if necessary
