## City of San Dimas Office of the City Manager - Update April 2, 2020

## Latest Updates:

- Governor Newsom unveiled a series of new resources to aid small businesses and help California workers who have lost jobs due to COVID-19
  - Beginning tomorrow, April 3, the federal government is offering first-come, first-serve loans of up to \$10 million for small business employers
  - o Governor Newsom announced \$50 million in loan guarantees for small businesses that may not be eligible for federal relief
  - o The State is also allowing small businesses to defer payment of sales and use taxes of up to \$50,000 for up to 12 months

  - The Governor also joined Bitwise Industries and the Kapor Center to launch <u>http://www.onwardca.org</u>, a new platform that will connect displaced California workers with more than 70,000 job opportunities in critical industries
- On March 31, Governor Newsom announced the "Stay Home. Save Lives. Check In" campaign urging Californians to make telephone calls to check in on older Californians in their life. The goal is to make sure older and at-risk Californians are staying healthy, safe, and connected while they remain at home to save lives.
  - o In coordination with non-profit, local 2-1-1 systems, the State of California also launched a hotline to help Californians answer questions, (833) 544-2374. The hotline will be a one-stop-shop for queries and assistance during this crisis
  - The State is also partnering with AARP to send mailers to older residents, 65 and older, with useful resources and information to help adapt to the stay at home older
- Drive-up mobile testing sites for COVID-19 are now open in Los Angeles County and the City of Los Angeles
  - Appointments required no walk-ups
  - At this time, COVID-19 testing is limited to the most vulnerable Los Angeles County residents who are:
    - 65 and older; and/or
    - Have underlying health conditions, including:
      - Diabetes
      - Heart disease
      - Hypertension
      - Chronic lung disease
      - Moderate to severe asthma
      - People who are immunocompromised, including as a result of cancer treatment, and/or have been subject to a mandatory 14-day quarantine period because they have been exposed to an individual with a confirmed case of COVID-19 and have more than seven days of the 2-week quarantine period remaining.
