- As we approach Passover and Easter, Los Angeles County continues to remind all residents that the Health
 Officer's <u>Safer at Home</u> order remains in full effect. This week is Holy Week, and it is a time when many want
 to be with their family and faith communities.
 - o Though the need to connect with friends and family is strong, group meals and social gatherings make social distancing difficult, and therefore, put everyone at risk. This is not the time for relatives and friends to come over and be close to each other. This is a time to distance yourself from others physically.
 - o While family members and contacts living together within a household can go for a walk in the neighborhood, contact with individuals from outside of the household should occur only virtually. Use social media and digital tools to connect, because face-to-face interactions with individuals from other households are prohibited under the Safer at Home order.
 - o Everyone must:
 - Stay home (stay unexposed and do not expose others)
 - Only go out for essential services or if they are an essential worker
 - Stay six feet or more away from others
 - Not gather in groups of any size
 - Los Angeles County is relying on its residents to respect and follow these health orders. Residents' cooperation with the health orders is critical as we work to flatten the curve and move beyond the pandemic.

 - Starting April 10, frontline health care workers who are exposed to or test positive for COVID-19 can find hotel rooms through the CalTravelStore

- Governor Newsom announced that starting this Sunday, April 12, California workers who are receiving unemployment benefits will begin receiving an extra \$600 on top of their weekly amount, as part of the new Pandemic Additional Compensation (PAC) initiated by the CARES act
