- Governor Gavin Newsom signed an executive order that will allow adults to obtain marriage licenses via videoconferencing rather than in person amidst the COVID-19 pandemic
 - Under the executive order, adults will be able to obtain a marriage license, at the discretion of their local county clerk, through videoconferencing, as long as both adults are located within the State of California, are present, and can present identification during the video conference. The license can then be issued via email

- This week, the CDC updated their guidance on how long people who are positive for COVID-19 should self-isolate
 - People who are positive, or presumed positive, for COVID-19 should self-isolate for 10 days and 72 hours after fever and symptoms subside. This means you must stay home until your fever has resolved without the use of fever-reducing medications and there is improvement in your respiratory symptoms for at least three days after recovery AND at least ten days have passed since your first symptoms appeared or you were tested
- The California Labor and Workforce Development Agency has partnered with One Fair Wage to launch the High Road Kitchen program in California
 - This initiative will provide grants for restaurants that agree to reopen and rehire employees at a livable wage
