- If you have been financially affected by COVID-19, you may qualify for California WIC. WIC provides healthy foods and other essential services to eligible families. Visit https://myFamily.WIC.ca.gov for more information
- COVID-19 has changed the way many organizations operate, including mosquito control. The San Gabriel Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District is still here for you, but they need your help
 - With the rain this week, it is even more important than ever to check around your yard for stagnant water and dump it out
 - Toss any unused containers around the home
 - Protect yourself with repellent if you are spending time outdoors

- Reminder: if you have symptoms of COVID-19 and want to get tested, please call your healthcare provider. If you do not have a provider, call 2-1-1 or visit https://covid19.lacounty.gov/testing to schedule an appointment at a drive-up mobile testing site. LA County is emphasizing that if you make an appointment for testing, please make sure you attend, otherwise you are taking a testing spot away from someone who might need it
- Beginning tomorrow, children who are normally eligible to get free or reduced-price school meals can
 apply for Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefits. P-EBT benefits will help families in California buy food when
 schools are closed. Apply and get up to \$365 per child to spend on groceries
