Latest Updates:

- June 15 is Elder Abuse Awareness Day. Protect seniors by knowing the signs of elder abuse. The Los Angeles County Adult Protective Services team provides in-person responses, 24/7. If you suspect elder abuse, call the Elder Abuse Hotline at 1-877-4RSENIORS (1-877-477-3646)
- The Bonita Unified School District office is now open to the public on a limited basis. Hours will be Monday – Friday from 10 am – 2 pm
- Effective July 1, the San Dimas Dog Park will be closed for servicing from 7 am 9 am on Wednesdays
- Contact tracing is a confidential and straightforward process that has been used by public health
 departments for decades to slow the spread of infectious diseases and avoid outbreaks. You can do
 your part by answering a few simple questions from the Health Department
 - o If you test positive for COVID-19, the Public Health Department will contact you to follow-up; it is essential to take this call. Public Health officials will ask you about the places you have been and the people you have been around while you were infectious. The people you mention will then be contacted, but they will not be told your name or contact information. They will be asked to stay home to help prevent others from getting sick
 - o If you have been in contact with someone with COVID-19, remain home for 14 days after your last contact with the person. Additionally, the Health Department will call you to follow-up; it is important to take this call. They will ask you if you are experiencing any symptoms or if you have been tested. They will also ask about places you may have been to. They will provide you with information on the next steps, as well as how to access services such as COVID-19 testing or how to find a doctor if you don't have one already.
