Latest Updates:

- Behind-the-wheel drive tests previously canceled due to COVID-19 will resume beginning tomorrow,
 June 26. The DMV anticipates it will take several weeks to complete testing for previously canceled
 tests. Appointments for new behind-the-wheel tests will not be available until previously canceled tests
 are completed. For the health and safety of customers and examiners, the DMV is instituting numerous

- Governor Gavin Newsom today released tools, technology, and data that will allow scientists, researchers, technologists, and all Californians to better understand the impact of COVID-19
 - This includes the California COVID Assessment Tool, or CalCAT, a "model of models" that
 contains assessments of the spread of COVID-19, short-term forecasts of disease trends, and
 scenarios of the course of the disease from modeling groups across the country
 - The state is also making the source code of CalCAT available to the public. the Governor has directed that the state's COVID-19 data be open and machine-readable by default, except to preserve privacy; that data be provided via dashboard, on California's open data portal; and that the data be available by direct connection to a database

- At the June 23 City Council meeting, the San Dimas City Council voted to transition the San Dimas Recreation Center from being a fully operational recreation program facility to an aquatics only operational facility. This transition is due to necessary facilities maintenance and improvements, budgetary cutbacks, and the COVID-19 pandemic
 - o The City will provide limited aquatics programming throughout the summer beginning July 6
 - All programs will be subject to first come, first served reservation protocol as the City of San Dimas will be adhering to State and County Aquatics Facility operation guidelines.
