- The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors has approved a \$1.22 billion spending package to fund a broad range of essential services and relief measures to assist people and businesses affected by the COVID-19 crisis. The plan covers spending in four main areas:
 - o \$656 million for public health measures including testing and contact tracing
 - \$200 million for financial support for residents in the form of assistance for rent relief, food, and child care
 - o \$160 million in grants to support small businesses
 - \$150 million to support the County workforce's response to the emergency, including disaster services workers and personal protective equipment for employees
