- Earlier this week, the USPS issued guidance to voters on returning vote-by-mail ballots. In California as long as your ballot is postmarked by Election Day (November 3) and received by the 17th day after the election, your ballot will be processed
 - A reminder that the USPS recommended that voters request their ballots at least 15 days before the election and mail their completed ballots at least one week before the due date
- High temperatures are expected through Saturday. Remember to limit outdoor activities, drink plenty
 of fluids, dress in loose-fitting, lightweight, and light-colored clothing, and remember never to leave
 children or pets in an enclosed car
- Today, Governor Gavin Newsom announced a series of actions to better serve workers that have experienced job loss during the COVID-19 pandemic, including the formation of an Employment Development Department (EDD) strike team and a renewed focus on processing unpaid claims. Specifically, the Governor will:
 - Deploy a strike team to modernize information technology programs and transform the customer experience
 - Focus on immediately processing claims
