Latest Updates:

- Reminder: Beginning **this Friday**, **July 10** (and continuing through September 30, 2020), Gladstone Street will be fully closed to thru-traffic at the railroad crossing 24 hours a day/7 days a week. Lone Hill Avenue (just west of the crossing) and Amelia Avenue (east of the crossing) will remain open and accessible by day of detour routes.
 - o Crews will be fully rebuilding the railroad crossing on Gladstone St. (San Dimas) as part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line light rail project

- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued a health advisory warning everyone to not use any hand sanitizer manufactured by "Eskbiochem SA de CV" in Mexico, due to the potential presence of methanol, a "toxic alcohol", as an active ingredient, which can cause blindness and/or death when absorbed through the skin or when swallowed. Most commercially available alcohol-based hand sanitizers or rubs contain either ethanol or isopropanol as active ingredients and are safe to use
