• Construction Reminders:

- Beginning TOMORROW, July 10 (and continuing through September 30, 2020), Gladstone Street will be fully closed to thru-traffic at the railroad crossing 24 hours a day/7 days a week. Lone Hill Avenue (just west of the crossing) and Amelia Avenue (east of the crossing) will remain open and accessible by day of detour routes.
 - Crews will be fully rebuilding the railroad crossing on Gladstone Street (San Dimas) as part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line light rail project

- The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) announced a 60-hour weekend closure of eastbound Interstate 10 (I-10) connector to southbound and northbound State Route 57 (SR-57) for pavement rehabilitation as part of the I-10 HOV Lane Construction Project beginning TOMORROW, July 10 at 7 pm until 6 am Monday, July 13
 - The weekend closure includes the eastbound I-10 off-ramp to Kellogg Drive
- The County of LA is looking for innovative ideas to assist businesses, streamline contracting processes, and identify potential cost-savings. This effort is part of the County's roadmap to economic recovery from the impacts of COVID-19

- Governor Newsom today announced significant changes to emergency operations and sheltering made to protect firefighters and residents in the event of evacuations
 - o In the past year and a half, California has made critical investments to fortify wildfire preparedness and response capabilities. CAL FIRE completed the last of its 35 emergency fuels management projects in May, making 90,000 acres safer ahead of wildfire season and protecting 200 vulnerable communities
 - The Governor also announced the State would hire 858 more firefighters and six California Conservation Corps (CCC) crews through October because of the COVID-19 pandemic
