Latest Updates:

- According to the South Coast Air Quality Management District, smoke from the Lake Fire and Ranch Fire burning in the region has caused unhealthy air quality in the following areas:
 - o Santa Clarita Valley
 - San Gabriel Mountains
 - o East San Gabriel Valley
 - o Pomona-Walnut Valley
 - If you can see smoke, soot, or ash, or you can smell smoke, pay attention to your immediate environment and take precautions to safeguard your health. These precautions are particularly important for children, older adults, and people with heart or lung diseases
