Latest Updates:

Local:

- Bobcat Fire update: the fire is currently 114,317 acres and 62% contained. Firefighters continue to contain the fire within its existing footprint by patrolling containment lines and mopping up around the fire perimeter. Patrols will occur along the northern portion of the fire to make sure communities are secure and will be alert for new activity. The southern perimeter of the fire remains moderated and in patrol and mop-up status from Mt. Wilson around to Crystal Lake
- The San Dimas Senior/Community Center will be open as a cooling center through Saturday, October 3. Cooling center hours will be 10 am – 6 pm. Visitors are required to wear face masks to enter the building, and social distancing will be enforced. For more information, call (909) 394-6290
- The City of San Dimas, LA County Sheriff-San Dimas Station, and the San Dimas H.E.R.O.E.S. is gearing up and for this year's National Night Out event on Tuesday, October 6. The activities will begin at 4:30 pm as the First Responder Caravan will travel around San Dimas, demonstrating their continued presence and responsiveness to the community
 - From 5:30 – 7:00 pm, residents are encouraged to show support at the National Night Out Drive-Thru located in the Civic Center Parking Lot (245 E. Bonita Ave.). First responder agencies and vehicles in attendance will include LA County Sheriff-San Dimas Station Patrol Cars, San Dimas Station Mounted Posse, LA County Fire Department-Engine 64, San Dimas Mountain Rescue, the California Highway Patrol, and more!
