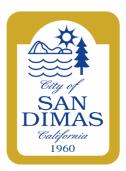

FISCAL IMPACT

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

It is the policy of the City of San Dimas to invest public funds in a manner that will provide an optimal combination of security and investment return while meeting the daily cash flow demands of the City and conforming to all State and local statutes governing the investment of public funds.

The priority objectives of the City's investment activities are as follows: safety, liquidity and returns.

The City's investment portfolio as of March 28, 2025 maintained liquid cash in the amount of \$17,059,536.85 held between BMO Harris, the City and LAIF and the CALTRUST Liquidity Fund. This amounts to just over 22% of the portfolio to provide the cash flow necessary for City payroll and operating expenditures, as well as large capital project expenses and unforeseen

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emergencies that may come up throughout the year. The following chart displays the total investments and weighted average yield per investment category:

The City's Banking Services Provider, BMO Harris, provides a fully collateralized checking account whose funds are used to make cash payments for City payroll and operational expenses. The City performs daily bank reconciliations to assure adequate cash is held in the checking account for upcoming expenditures. Cash held in the account earns income credits that accumulate at a rate of .75% which offsets banking service charges that are charged each quarter to the City. As of June 10, 2024, the City opened a collateralized money market account with BMO Harris.

Petty Cash is held at City facilities for cashiering purposes and to reimburse small dollar expenditures between \$0.01 and \$50.00.

The Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) is considered a Local Agency Investment Pool and acts much like a money market account. Funds can be deposited and withdrawn without penalty. The pool invests funds in short-term securities and can produce returns at rates like money markets but is considered more secure.

CALTRUST is a public agency that provides investment funds that are liquid, short term, and medium term. The assets held by CALTRUST are managed by State Street Global Advisors. Since the City first invested with CALTRUST in August of 2010, buying into the Medium-Term Fund. The City has made various contributions throughout the years, as well as reinvested any accumulated interest earnings throughout the life of the fund.

In total the weighted average cost of investing in CALTRUST is \$9.98. Until interest rates decline to the point that share price would increase to \$9.98 or above, the City would be recognizing a loss on sale. However, the City could pull out funds at any time if liquidity needs arose.

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Beginning in the month of December 2023, the City opened a liquid fund with CALTRUST which is not subject to market rate adjustments due to the type of investments utilized. The fund yielded 4.41% for the month of March, out yielding LAIF by .08%. The City intends to take advantage of the high yielding short term investments until yields are no longer inverted.

The City Treasurer also utilizes Brokers to purchase investment securities such as Government Sponsored Enterprises (Agency Bonds), Corporate Bonds, U.S. Treasuries and Negotiable CD's.

The investment policy and California Government Code Section 53600.3 allows the City to invest 30% of its portfolio in Certificates of Deposit and 20% of its portfolio in Corporate Bonds through Brokers. U.S. Treasuries and Government Sponsored Enterprises (Agency Bonds) have no investment limits.

The weighted average maturity for all City investments is 1.60 years, short term investments with

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maturity within six months continues to draw higher yields; however, longer-term yields have been increasing, making investing in longer term assets more appealing.

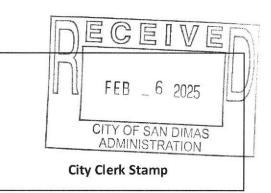

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIMAS, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING MUNICIPAL CODE TEXT AMENDMENT 24-11, A REQUEST TO AMEND THE CITY OF SAN DIMAS MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 18 AS NECESSARY TO REMOVE VERBIAGE REGARDING THE INITIATION PROCESS FOR ZONE CHANGE AND MUNICIPAL CODE TEXT AMENDMENTS.

WHEREAS, an Amendment to the San Dimas Municipal Code has been duly initiated by the City of San Dimas; and

WHEREAS, the Amendment is described as a Municipal Code Text Amendment to amend the City of San Dimas Municipal Code, Title 18, Chapter 18.208 Zone Changes and Amendments as necessary to amend the process for zone changes and amendments; and

WHEREAS, the Amendment would be applicable City wide; and

WHEREAS, notice was duly given of the public hearing on the matter and that public hearing was held on December 19, 2024, and at such meeting staff requested the item be continued to the next regularly scheduled meeting of January 16, 2025, and at such meeting staff again requested the Planning Commission continue the item to the next regularly scheduled meeting of February 20, 2025, where the Planning Commission heard evidence and voted 5-0 to recommend approval of Municipal Code Text Amendment 24-11 to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, notice was duly given of the public hearing on the matter and that public hearing was held on April 8 2025 at the hour of 7:00 p.m., with all testimony received being made a part of the public record; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments will be consistent with one of the recommendations from the Development Process Performance Audit that was completed in 2023 by Matrix Consulting Group. Based on the consultant's assessment and analysis, they recommended removing duplicated procedural process; and

WHEREAS, all requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act and the City's Environmental Guidelines have been met for the consideration of whether the project will have a significant effect on the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the evidence received at the hearing, and for the reasons discussed by the City Council at the hearing, the City Council now finds as follows:

A. The proposed Municipal Code Text Amendment will not adversely affect adjoining property as to value, precedent or be detrimental to the area.

The proposed Municipal Code Text Amendment is intended to eliminate duplicative processes, reduce procedural ambiguity, and improve efficiency for applicants. The proposed amendment will not adversely affect property values, establish negative precedents, or result in detrimental impacts to the community. Instead, the proposed amendment seeks to promote a more efficient and transparent review process by eliminating unnecessary procedural steps and saving the applicant's time.

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B. The proposed Municipal Code Text Amendment will further the public health, safety and general welfare.

The proposed amendments advance the general welfare of San Dimas by refining the review process to remove redundancies and reduce confusion in the application procedures. It eliminates the previously required step of review by the Planning Commission to initiate a municipal code text amendment or zone change only to hear the same evidence the next month again thereby creating a more efficient and streamlined approach of hearing the item for consideration only once. This ensures that applications are processed in a manner that is clear, consistent, and supportive of public health, safety, and welfare.

C. The proposed Municipal Code Text Amendment is consistent with the General Plan.

The proposed amendments are aligned with the following goals from the General Plan.

Housing Element

a. Goal Statement HE-3.4 aims to maintain an efficient entitlement process with coordinated permit processing, objective design review and standards, and environmental clearance procedures.

NOW, THEREFORE, the CITY COUNCIL of the CITY OF SAN DIMAS, California, does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. ADOPTION. Municipal Code Text Amendment 24-11 amending the City of San Dimas Municipal Code, Title 18, Chapter 18.208 Zone Changes and Amendments as necessary to amend the process for zone changes and amendments as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein and hereby adopted.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. CEQA DETERMINATION. The City Council hereby finds and determines that is can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this ordinance may have a significant adverse effect on the environment. Thus, the adoption of this ordinance is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE AND PUBLICATION. This Ordinance shall take effect 30 days after its final passage. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and cause the same to be posted at the duly designated posting places within the City and published once within 15 days after passage and adoption as may be required by law in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of San Dimas hereby designated for that purpose; or, in the alternative, the City Clerk may cause to be published a summary of this Ordinance and certified copy of the text of this Ordinance shall be posted in the Office of the City Clerk five days prior to

the date of adoption of this Ordinance; and, within 15 days after adoption, the City Clerk shall cause to be published, the aforementioned summary and shall post a certified copy of this Ordinance, together with the vote for and against the same, in the Office of the City Clerk.

SECTION 1. Section 18.208. is hereby amended to read as follows: **18.208.010 Purpose.**

The purpose of this chapter is to set forth procedures by which this title may be amended to impose regulations not heretofore imposed, to remove or modify any regulation heretofore imposed, and to change zones or alter boundaries of districts. (Ord. 37 § 650.0, 1961; Ord. 286 § 2, 1970)

18.208.020 Procedure.

A. Initiation. A change of zone or other amendment described in Section 18.208.010 may be initiated by the city council, by the planning commission or an applicant as follows: pursuant to a petition filed as provided in this chapter.

1. A change of zone or other amendment may also be initiated by filing the appropriate application and fee with the Community Development Department by an applicant or the owner(s) or authorized agents of property for which the zone change is being sought. If the property is under multiple ownership all owners or their authorized agents shall join in filing the application.

B. Petition Filing Fee. Upon paying a filing fee as adopted by city council resolution, a property owner or his authorized representative may file with the director a petition for a change of zone or other amendment on forms provided by the city.

<u>BC.</u> <u>Application</u> <u>Petition</u> Contents for Zone Change. The <u>application</u> petition shall be complete and shall show:

1. When was existing zoning effective and are there changed conditions to warrant other or additional zoning?

2. Will the proposed change of zone adversely affect the adjoining property as to value, precedent, or be detrimental to the area?

3. Will a change of zone be in the interest of furtherance of public health, safety and general welfare?

4. Such other information as the commission deems necessary.

The <u>application</u> petition shall be verified, dated and accompanied by a certified list as shown on the latest available assessment roll of the county of the names and addresses of all persons to whom all property is assessed within three hundred feet of the exterior boundaries of the property described in the <u>application petition</u>.

<u>CD.</u> <u>Application</u> <u>Petition</u> —Contents for Other Than Zone Change. The <u>application</u> <u>petition</u> shall be complete and shall show:

- 1. The nature of the amendment sought.
- 2. The sections of this title affected.
- 3. The reasons for the proposed amendment.
- 4. Will the amendment further the public health, safety and welfare?
- 5. Will the amendment adversely affect other properties?
- 6. Are there changed conditions to warrant the amendment?
- 7. Such other information as the commission deems necessary.

E. Duty of Commission. A petition for a change of zone or other amendment shall be construed as a suggestion only. The commission shall not be required to hold a hearing upon



the filing of a petition. The filing fee shall be refunded should the commission elect not to hold a hearing.

DF. Investigation. The planning department shall investigate the facts bearing on the proposed zone change or other amendment to provide information necessary to assure action consistent with the intent of this title and the general plan.

G. Determination Regarding Hearing. The petition and the investigation of the planning department shall be submitted to the planning commission. If the planning commission deems it necessary or desirable, it shall order the planning director to set a hearing thereon. The hearing shall be set not less than fifteen nor more than sixty days thereafter.

EH. Notice of Hearing. Notice of public hearing shall be given in the following ways, and shall contain the date, time and place of the hearing and, in the case of a hearing for a change of zone, a general description of the property for which a change of zone is sought.

1. Notice shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the city not less than ten days before the date of hearing.

2. Notices shall be posted not less than ten days before the date of the hearing in a conspicuous place at City Hall, the Los Angeles County public library, and the post office.

3. Except in those cases where the planning commission determines that notice by United States Mail is impractical, notices for a hearing for a change of zone shall be mailed not less than ten days before the hearing to owners of property within a radius of three hundred feet of the exterior boundaries of the property described in the petition, as shown on the latest available assessment roll of the county.

EI. Commission Recommendations. The commission shall recommend to the city council approval or disapproval of the proposed change of zone or other amendment within forty days after the conclusion of the hearing. The recommendation shall include the reasons therefor along with the following findings:

1. Whether or not the proposed change of zone or other amendment will adversely affect the adjoining property as to value, precedent or be detrimental to any area.

2. Whether or not the change of zone or other amendment will further the public health, safety and general welfare.

3. Whether or not the change of zone or other amendment is consistent with the general plan and any applicable special plans.

The recommendation shall be filed with the council and a copy thereof mailed to the petitioner.

GJ. Council Procedure. Upon receipt of the recommendation of the planning commission, the council shall hold a public hearing; provided, however, that if the matter under consideration is an amendment to a zoning ordinance to change property from one zone to another, and the planning commission has recommended against the adoption of such amendment, the city council shall not be required to take any further action thereon unless an appeal is made in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 18.212, except as modified by subsection K \underline{H} of this section.

HK. Council Action. The council may approve, modify or disapprove the recommendation of the commission; provided, that any modification of the proposed ordinance or amendment by the council shall first be referred to the planning commission for report and recommendation, but the planning commission shall not be required to hold a public hearing thereon. Failure of the planning commission to report within forty days after the reference, or such longer period as may be designated by the council, shall be deemed to be approval of the proposed modification.

L. Notification. The petitioner shall be notified by mail of the council's final action.

Subject: Introduction and First Reading of Ordinance 1323 Establishing Chapter 5.120 – Film Permit Requirements.

SUMMARY

The proposed ordinance establishes a comprehensive framework for regulating filming activity in the City of San Dimas by adding Chapter 5.120 to the Municipal Code. This ordinance clarifies permit requirements, sets forth conditions and exemptions for filming activity, outlines responsibilities of permit holders, and establishes enforcement procedures.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council:

- 1. Introduce and waive full reading of Ordinance 1323, An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of San Dimas, County of Los Angeles, California, Adding Chapter 5.120 of the San Dimas Municipal Code Regarding Film Permit Requirements.
- 2. Schedule the second reading and adoption of the Ordinance for a future regular City Council meeting.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no direct fiscal impact associated with adopting the ordinance. However, the ordinance establishes authority for the City to collect application fees and recover costs for City services related to permitted filming activities.

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BACKGROUND

The City of San Dimas has historically welcomed filming activity; however, existing regulations are limited. To promote the City as a filming destination while ensuring proper oversight, staff developed a new ordinance that:

- Aligns with best practices and State guidelines established by the California Film Commission.
- Provides clarity on when permits are required and exemptions that apply.
- Establishes a formal application process and criteria for approval.
- Defines insurance, indemnification, and cost recovery requirements.
- Enables enforcement mechanisms to address violations.

In accordance with California Government Code Section 14999.21, the draft ordinance was submitted to the California Film Commission on April 11, 2025. The City will consider any findings from the Commission and incorporate any necessary changes prior to finalizing the ordinance at a future meeting when the second reading takes place.

The City recently entered into an agreement with Inland Empire Film Services to process film permits and to manage the production companies to assure compliance with all stipulations we put into place for filming.

Dan Taylor, who is the Film Commissioner with Inland Empire Film Services and our primary contact person, highly recommended that the City adopts a film ordinance. Based on his past experience, municipalities that did not have a film ordinance in place have little to no ability to enforce film production companies to restore filming locations to their original state, which may impact the quality of life of our residents.

The sooner an ordinance can be adopted, the sooner we can ensure that production issues are limited and resolved in a timely manner.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

The ordinance provides a balanced regulatory framework for facilitating filming activity in the City. Key features include:

- Permit Requirement and Exemptions: A permit is required for commercial filming activities that impact public property or involve exclusive control of spaces. Exemptions are provided for personal filming, news media, and student projects not requiring special accommodations.
- Permit Process and Conditions: Applicants must submit detailed permit applications subject to review and approval by the City Manager or designee. The ordinance outlines specific conditions to minimize impacts to public safety, traffic, and surrounding properties.
- Insurance and Indemnification: All permittees must provide proof of general liability insurance and agree to indemnify the City for any claims arising from filming activity.
- Fees and Cost Recovery: The ordinance authorizes the City to impose application fees and collect reimbursements for personnel and services provided to support filming.

- Enforcement: Violations may be pursued as either infractions or misdemeanors.
 Administrative penalties and remedies under existing Municipal Code sections with the section of the section of
 - Administrative penalties and remedies under existing Municipal Code sections will also apply.

By adopting this ordinance, the City will have an enforceable regulatory mechanism that encourages responsible filming activity, enhances transparency, and ensures that any filming within the City occurs in a manner that protects the public and City infrastructure.

ALTERNATIVES

- 1. Provide direction to staff for modifications and continue the item.
- 2. Do not introduce the ordinance and maintain current filming regulations.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

Pursuant to CEQA guidelines Section 15061 (b)(3), CEQA does not apply to this item because there is no potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Therefore, no additional environmental review is needed at this time.

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ORDINANCE 1323

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIMAS, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA, ADDING CHAPTER 5.120 OF THE SAN DIMAS MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING FILM PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

WHEREAS, the City of San Dimas ("City") desires to actively promote and encourage filming within City limits; and

WHEREAS, to ensure public health and safety, as well as the safe use of property during filming, the City desires to specify film permit requirements for all filming activity that occurs within the City; and

WHEREAS, the California Film Commission ("Commission") reviews all local ordinances establishing procedures for issuing film permits, and pursuant to Government Code Section 14999.21, local government agencies are required to submit any draft filming ordinance to the Commission at least 30 days prior to adoption; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 14999.21, within 5 working days the Commission is required to provide its findings, which are advisory, to the agency, and prior to the adoption of the final ordinance the local legislative body must consider the Commission's findings; and

WHEREAS, the City submitted a draft of this ordinance for the Commission for its review, and has considered the Commission's findings prior to its adoption.

NOW, THEREFORE, the CITY COUNCIL of the CITY OF SAN DIMAS, California, does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (O) of Section 5.24.070 of the San Dimas Municipal Code, pertaining to licenses fees for movie filming, is hereby deleted, and the remaining subsections of Section 5.24.070 shall be re-lettered in alphabetical order.

<u>SECTION 2. NEW CHAPTER.</u> A new chapter 5.120 is hereby added to the San Dimas Municipal Code to read in its entirety as follows:

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Chapter 5.120 FILM PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

Sections: 5.120.010 Purpose. 5.120.020 Definitions. 5.120.030 Film Permit Required and Exemptions. 5.120.040 Film Permit Application and Conditions. 5.120.050 Film Permit Denial, Suspension and Revocation. 5.120.070 Insurance and Indemnification. 5.120.080 Fees and Cost Reimbursement. 5.120.090 Administrative Regulations. 5.120.100 Violation and Penalties.

5.120.010 Purpose.

The purpose of this chapter is to facilitate filming, videotaping, photographing, and other visual recording activities within the city, whether on public or private property, in a manner that does not unreasonably interfere with the public peace, quiet enjoyment, health, and safety, including traffic, parking, and pedestrian circulation, and the use of or access to public property and facilities, or unreasonably endanger any property.

5.120.020 Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply in this chapter:

- A. "Filming activities" means and includes all activity attendant to staging or shooting commercial motion pictures, television shows or programs, commercials, digital media, or still photography, in any medium including film, tape or digital format.
- B. "News media" means Filming Activities conducted by agents or employees of any organization whose main purpose is the dissemination of news, current or recent events or happenings, including but not limited to newspapers, news services, television or cable news shows or similar forums. This definition also includes the photographing, filming or videotaping for the purpose of spontaneous, unplanned television news broadcasts (breaking news) or reporting for print media by reporters, photographers or camerapersons. This definition does not include news magazine shows (such as Dateline, 20/20, etc.) where filming is for air at a much later date.
- C. "Student filming activity" means and includes all activity attendant to staging or shooting student films produced to satisfy a school course requirement at an educational institution. In order to qualify as a student filming activity, each person participating in the filming activity must be listed on a letter from their school, on school letterhead, stating (1) they are a student in good standing, (2) this filming is being conducted to satisfy a school course requirement, and (3) the resulting film is not for commercial use.

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D. "Studio" means a fixed place of business certified as such by a local fire authority having jurisdiction, where filming activities (motion or still photography) are regularly conducted upon the premises.

5.120.030 Film Permit Required and Exemptions.

- A. No person shall conduct any Filming Activity in the city without first obtaining a permit issued by the city.
- B. No firm permit shall be required for the following Filming Activities:
 - 1. Filming conducted solely for non-commercial purposes, including, but not limited to, personal, private or family use, or student filming activity, which does not require the placement of equipment, parking of vehicles, or other use or control of public property to the exclusion of others, and is not intended for posting or streaming online to an account intended to passively or actively receive compensation in any way shape or form.
 - 2. Filming for news media, including, but not limited to, newspapers, magazines, news services, broadcast stations, television or cable news shows, internet news programs, and similar news media, for the primary purpose of disseminating news, recent events, and other current, public affairs.
 - 3. Filming activities (motion or still photography) conducted at a studio entirely on or within private property, which does not require the placement of equipment on, parking of vehicles on, or other use or control of public property to the exclusion of others.

5.120.040 Film Permit Application and Conditions.

- A. Each film permit application shall be completed in full on the form provided by the city or third party designee and must be filed with the City Manager or designee.
- B. The City Manager or designee may issue a film permit in accordance with this Chapter upon determining the applicant has demonstrated in the application that the following criteria are met:
 - 1. The proposed filming activity will not unduly interfere with traffic or pedestrian movement; close any public street, sidewalk, parkway or other rights-of-way for an unreasonable period of time, or unduly interfere with nearby residents' or business owners' quiet, peaceful enjoyment of their property.
 - 2. The proposed filming activity will not endanger public safety or property, including, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. The proposed filming activity will not unduly impede, obstruct or interfere with the operation of emergency vehicles or equipment in or through the permitted area.
 - b. The proposed filming activity will not constitute a fire hazard or any other type of hazard and all proper safety precautions will be taken as necessary to protect the public health, safety, and general welfare.

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- 3. The proposed filming activity will not endanger or threaten damage to public property.
- 4. The proposed filming activity will not unduly interfere with normal governmental functions or city services and operations, or conflict with previously scheduled events.
- 5. The proposed filming activity will not otherwise be detrimental to the public health or safety.
- C. The city may require the permittee to comply with the following point of contact requirements for coordinating unusual occurrences, managing public relations, schedule modifications, and receiving and addressing complaints associated with filming activities:
 - 1. The permittee shall designate, and ensure the availability of, a point of contact for the coordination of unusual occurrences and large-scale emergencies when a state of emergency has been declared, managing public relations associated with filming activities, and managing filming activity schedule modifications including cancelling, delaying, rescheduling, and relocating.
 - 2. The permittee shall designate a point of contact to receive complaints on a 24 hour/7 day a week basis and ensure that complaints are addressed in a timely manner, including when appropriate, referral of complaints to appropriate city personnel or designee.
- D. Following issuance of a permit by the city, the permittee shall comply with the following requirements prior to and during filming activity:
 - 1. The permittee shall post temporary no parking signage and lane, street and road closure requests as directed by the city or designee.
 - 2. The permittee shall maintain the film permit in hard copy form at the filming location at all times for the duration of the filming activity.
 - 3. The permittee shall ensure reasonable advance notification of upcoming filming activity is provided to residents and businesses who may be impacted by the filming activity. Notice shall include a description of the filming activity, in particular any filming activity that is likely to generate public concern such as special effects, gunfire, or explosions.
 - 4. The permittee shall receive complaints at all times and respond to and address complaints in a timely manner, on an initial basis in no less than one calendar day.

5.120.050 Film Permit Denial, Suspension, and Revocation.

- A. The City Manager or designee may deny issuance of a film permit if the requirements of this Chapter and all applicable laws and regulations have not been met, or if the application contains incomplete, false or misleading information.
- B. The City Manager or designee may immediately suspend or revoke a film permit if the requirements of this Chapter and all applicable laws and regulations are not met; the information supplied by the permittee becomes, or is determined to be, false or incomplete;

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or any substantial change in circumstances renders the filming detrimental to the public health, safety or general welfare.

5.120.060 Insurance and Indemnification.

- A. Prior to issuance of a film permit, the applicant shall furnish general liability insurance in amounts as determined by the City's City Manager but in no event less than one million dollars and name the City of San Dimas, its City Council, officers, agents, employees, and volunteers as additional insureds. A certificate of insurance and a letter of endorsement shall be furnished to the City Manager or designee.
- B. Prior to issuance of a film permit, the applicant shall execute an agreement, on a form approved by the City Attorney, to indemnify, defend, and hold the City harmless from all claims and liability arising out of the issuance of the film permit and its use for filming activities.

5.120.070 Fees and Cost Reimbursement.

- A. Each permit application shall be accompanied by payment of a non-refundable application fee to reimburse the City for costs incurred to review the application, in the amount established by resolution of the City Council.
- B. The permittee shall be required to reimburse the City for any personnel provided to the permittee for the purpose of assisting the filming activities, and may be required to provide a deposit, in an amount determined by the City Manager, to be applied to the costs to the city of assisting the filming activities.

5.120.080 Administrative Regulations.

The City Manager or designee is hereby authorized to promulgate reasonable rules and regulations consistent with the purposes of this chapter. Violations of the administrative regulations adopted pursuant to this Section shall constitute violations of this Chapter, and shall subject the violator to the penalties set forth in this Chapter.

5.120.090 Violation and Penalties.

- A. Violation of any provision of this Chapter shall be either an infraction or a misdemeanor, at the discretion of the city attorney. Where the violation is of a continuing nature, each day that the violation continues constitutes a separate and distinct violation.
- B. Any person who violates any provision of this Chapter shall be subject to administrative penalties pursuant to Chapter 1.06 of this Code and the penalties established in Chapter 1.12 of this Code.
- C. The remedies provided in this Chapter are not exclusive, and nothing in this Chapter shall preclude the city from seeking other remedies, penalties or procedures provided by law.

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SECTION 3. CEQA DETERMINATION. The City Council hereby finds and determines that it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this ordinance may have a significant adverse effect on the environment. Thus, the adoption of this ordinance is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE AND PUBLICATION. This Ordinance shall take effect 30 days after its final passage. The City Clerk shall certify the adoption of this Ordinance and cause the same to be posted and/or published as required by law.

BACKGROUND

In 2017, the Administrative Services Department conducted a complete revision of the Statement of Investment Policy to provide clear objectives, guidelines, and suitable investment options.

Since then, the City has conducted annual reviews of the Statement of Investment Policy to assure compliance with California Government Code section 53600.3 and any new laws or regulations that may dictate the means in which we may invest our idle funds.

The City's Statement of Investment Policy dictates the objectives, investment authorization and authority, authorized and suitable investments, diversification of securities and maturities and reporting guidelines that are in conformity with California Government Code Section 53600.3.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

Per the City of San Dimas Municipal Code, an annual action is required to designate a position authorized to invest City funds in accordance with an approved investment policy. This resolution would grant this designation and authority to the Administrative Services Director/ Treasurer.

Any investment would require the City Manager's or designee's approval, which is typically the Assistant City Manager in the City Manager's absence, as well as reporting such investments to the City Council 30 days after the transaction.

ALTERNATIVES

The City Council could request revisions to the policy to be implemented and brought back to the Council for approval at the following Council meeting.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

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RESOLUTION 2025-21

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIMAS, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, APPROVING THE CITY INVESTMENT POLICY FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2026, DELEGATING AUTHORITY TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DIRECTOR/TREASURER TO INVEST CITY FUNDS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE INVESTMENT POLICY SUBJECT TO CITY MANAGER OR DESIGNEE, APPROVAL, AND REQUIRING THE CITY TREASURER TO PROVIDE MONTHLY REPORTS OF INVESTMENT TRANSACTIONS TO THE CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the City of San Dimas, California (City) has established an Investment Policy to provide an optimal combination of security and investment return while meeting the daily cash flow demands of the City and conforming to all State and local statutes governing the investment of public funds; and

WHEREAS, the Investment Policy dictates the objectives, investment authorization and authority, authorized and suitable investments, diversification of securities and maturities, and reporting guidelines that are in conformity with California Government Code Section 53600.3; and

WHEREAS, the Investment Policy requires an annual review and approval by the City Council to ensure compliance with California Government Code and any new laws or regulations that may impact the investment of idle funds; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the proposed Investment Policy for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, and finds that it provides clear objectives, guidelines, and suitable investment options for the City's funds; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to delegate the authority to the Administrative Services Director/Treasurer to invest City funds in accordance with the Investment Policy, subject to approval by the City Manager, and to require the Administrative Services Director/Treasurer to provide monthly reports of investment transactions to the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of San Dimas does hereby resolve that:

SECTION 1. The City Council of the City of San Dimas hereby approves the City Investment Policy for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, as attached as Exhibit A.

SECTION 2. The Administrative Services Director/Treasurer is hereby authorized to invest City funds in accordance with the approved Investment Policy, subject to approval by the City Manager.

SECTION 3. The Administrative Services Director/Treasurer shall provide a monthly report of all investment transactions to the City Council within 30 days following the end of each month, certifying compliance with the City's Investment Policy.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk shall attest and certify the adoption of this resolution.

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EXHIBIT A

CITY OF SAN DIMAS STATEMENT OF INVESTMENT POLICY

- 1. POLICY: It is the policy of the City of San Dimas to invest public funds in a manner that will provide an optimal combination of security and investment return while meeting the daily cash flow demands of the City and conforming to all State and local statutes governing the investment of public funds.
- 2. SCOPE: This investment policy applies to the investment of all financial assets of the City, except for those of the City's deferred compensation plans, the management of which is distinct and is not governed by this Investment Policy, and bond and financing proceeds, which will be made in accordance with the provisions of the applicable indentures or financing documents. For the purpose of investment of bond and financing proceeds into vehicles authorized by the provisions of the applicable indentures or financing documents but not by this policy, all funds are pooled with the General Fund to facilitate ease of handling and to minimize costs of maintaining multiple investment accounts. Earnings on the pool of funds are allocated on a periodic basis to the respective individual funds.
- 3. PRUDENCE: California Government Code section 53600.3 classifies all governing bodies of local agencies or persons authorized to make investment decision on behalf of those local agencies investing public funds as trustees, and therefore fiduciaries subject to the prudent investor standard. The prudent investor standard requires that when investing, reinvesting, purchasing, acquiring, exchanging, selling, or managing public funds, a trustee shall act with care, skill, prudence, and diligence under the circumstances then prevailing, including, but not limited to, the general economic conditions and the anticipated needs of the agency, that a prudent person acting in a like capacity and familiarity with those matters would use in the conduct of funds of a like character and with like aims, to safeguard the principal and maintain the liquidity needs of the agency.
- 4. OBJECTIVES: The Chief objectives, in priority order, of the City's Investment activities shall be:
 - Safety: Safety of principal is the foremost objective of the investment program. Investments of the City shall be undertaken in a manner that seeks to ensure the preservation of capital in the overall portfolio. To attain this objective, the City will diversify its investments to minimize the risk of loss resulting from over concentration of assets in a specific maturity range, of a specific issuer, or in a specific class of securities.

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- Liquidity: The City's investment portfolio will be managed to ensure sufficient liquidity to enable the City to meet all reasonably anticipated operating requirements, and should consist of securities with an active secondary or resale market.
- Return on Investment: The City's investment portfolio shall be designed with the objective of attaining an optimal return throughout budgetary and economic cycles within established portfolio safety and liquidity parameters.
- 5. AUTHORIZATION AND DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY: Under and as specified by California Government Code Section 53601, the legislative body of a local agency (i.e., the City Council) is authorized to invest money in its treasury that is not required for immediate needs. As permitted under California Government Code Section 53607, the City Council with the approval of this Policy delegates management responsibility for the investment program for a concurrent and renewable period of one-year to the City Treasurer or in his/her designee, who shall assume full responsibility for those transactions until the delegation of the authority is revoked or expires, and who shall make a monthly report of those transactions to the City Council.
- 6. ETHICS AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST: All City officers and employees involved in the City's investment process shall act responsibly as custodians of the public trust, and refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution of the investment program or which could impair their ability to make impartial investment and portfolio management decisions.
- 7. AUTHORIZED AND SUITABLE INVESTMENTS: The City is empowered by statute (California Government Code Section 53600 et seg.) to invest money in certain types of securities and funds. Within that empowerment, the City restricts eligible securities and funds to those listed below. Each type listed is subject to various specific requirements and restrictions, imposed by the above referenced California Government Code Section, and by the City by way of this Investment Policy.
 - U.S. Treasury Securities
 - Federal Agency and U.S. Government-Sponsored Enterprise Obligations
 - Medium Term Notes
 - Corporate Bonds
 - Commercial Paper
 - Time Deposits (including non-negotiable Certificates of Deposit)
 - Negotiable Certificates of Deposit
 - Bankers' Acceptances
 - Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF)
 - Los Angeles County Investment Pool (LACIP)
 - Cal Trust
 - Shares of Beneficial Interest issued by a Joint Powers Authority
 - Repurchase Agreements
 - Mutual Funds



- Money Market Mutual Funds
- U.S. Supranational Securities
- Municipal Bonds

Except as specifically authorized by the City Council in advance, no investment shall be made in any security that at the time of investment has a term remaining to maturity in excess of five years.

As a Local Agency, except for certain securities described in the below section, the City is specifically prohibited from investing in inverse floaters, range notes, mortgage- derived interest-only strips, <u>or any securities that could result in zero interest accrual if held</u> to maturity (California Government Code section 53601.6).

- 8. SAFEKEEPING AND CUSTODY: All security transactions shall be conducted on a deliver-versus-payment (DVP) basis. Securities shall be held by a third-party qualified custodian and evidenced by monthly safekeeping statements.
- 9. DIVERSIFICATION OF SECURITIES AND MATURITIES: The City shall maintain a diversified portfolio to minimize the risk of loss resulting from over concentration of assets in a specific maturity range, of a specific issuer, or in a specific security type.

The City employs a passive investment strategy, by which the City's full intent at the time of purchase is to hold all investments until maturity. Investments shall be made and maintained to match the City's projected cash flow requirements. Investments shall be made in realization that market prices of securities will vary depending on economic and interest rate conditions at any point in time. In the context of both the City's primary investment goals (safety, liquidity, return on investment), the sale of individual securities prior to maturity for purposes of portfolio reconfiguration may be appropriate.

The City's maturity matrix guideline ranges are as follows:

Maturity Range	Guideline Portfolio Percentage 30%
1 Day to 1 Year	- 100%
1 Year to 3 Years	5%- 60%
3 Years to 5 Years	0%- 40%

- 10. INTERNAL CONTROLS: Internal policies and procedures shall be maintained to assure that appropriate controls are in place to document and confirm all transactions. Transaction authority shall be separated from accounting and record keeping. An independent analysis by an external auditor shall be conducted annually to review internal control, account activity and compliance with policies and procedures.
- 11. PERFORMANCE STANDARDS: Given the City's passive investment strategy and the

strategy for maturities diversification, the average weighted maturity of the portfolio will normally approximate two years. The basis used by the Treasurer to determine

whether market yields are being achieved shall be to bench mark portfolio returns as of the end of the month and the average of portfolio returns for the last twelve month ends against comparable two-year Treasury Constant Maturity Yields.

12. REPORTING: The City Treasurer or his/her designee shall provide the City Council and the City Manager a monthly Investment Report within 30 days following the end of the month covered by the report. Each report shall be certified the City Treasurer or his/her designee, signifying compliance with the City's Investment Policy.

Each report shall include the type of investment, issuer, Par and dollar amount invested, maturity date and interest rate. In accordance with California Government Code Section 53646, the City shall provide a copy of its Investment Policy and will supersede previous applicable language.

- 13. LEGISLATIVE CHANGES: Any State of California legislative action that further restricts allowable securities, investments, portfolio limits or any other elements of this policy will be incorporated in the City's Investment Policy and will supersede previous applicable language.
- 14. INVESTMENT POLICY ADOPTION: The City's Investment Policy shall be reviewed at least annually and adopted by resolution of the City Council at a public meeting. Any modification to the Investment Policy must be considered by the City Council at a public meeting.

Appointments to Intergovernmental Agencies are done in April to accommodate the scheduled meetings and conferences of those agencies.

Annually the League of California Cities (LCC) and the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) requests confirmation of the City's voting delegate and alternates for the Annual Business meetings. This is an important aspect of the conferences to consider and take action on conference resolutions that can improve the quality, responsiveness, and vitality of local government in California. It is important that all cities be represented. This year the SCAG conference is May 1, 2025, in Palm Desert and the LCC conference is October 8-10, 2025, in Long Beach. At the May 14, 2024, City Council meeting, Council appointed Mayor Pro Tem Nakano as the delegate and Councilmember Bratakos as the alternate for SCAG. The Mayor is the automatic delegate for the LCC and the City Manager or his designee as the alternate.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

Councilmembers represent the City of San Dimas on numerous other agency boards. By doing so they are involved in some of the planning and decision making for policies and programs that can affect the City of San Dimas and many other cities in the region. Some of the agency appointments provide compensation to the appointee.

As part of the appointment process, the City must post on its website FPPC Form 806, which lists all the paid appointed position to which an official will vote to appoint themselves. This form must be posted prior to a vote (consent item) if the appointee will participate in the decision and appointment results in additional compensation to the appointee. (FPPC Regulation 18702.5)

FPPC Regulation 18702.5 provides that as long as the public is informed prior to a vote, an official may vote to hold another position even when the vote results in additional compensation to the appointee.

Attached to this report is a brief description of each outside agency, including meeting days and times, to provide context for the appointment process.

ALTERNATIVES

There are no alternatives being presented for this item as City representation on outside agencies can promote advocacy, engagement and collaboration.
