

RESOLUTION 2026-19

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIMAS, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, APPOINTING EMMETT G. BADAR TO THE OFFICE OF MAYOR FOR A FULL TERM OF TWO YEARS, ERIC NAKANO TO THE OFFICE OF COUNCILMEMBER, DISTRICT 2, FOR A FULL TERM OF FOUR YEARS, AND RYAN A. VIENNA TO THE OFFICE OF COUNCILMEMBER, DISTRICT 4, FOR A FULL TERM OF FOUR YEARS, IN LIEU OF AN ELECTION, AND CANCELLING THE JUNE 2, 2026 GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION CONTEST FOR THE OFFICES OF MAYOR AND COUNCILMEMBERS DISTRICTS 2 and 4, PURSUANT TO ELECTIONS CODE SECTION 10229

WHEREAS, on January 13th, 2026, the City Council adopted Resolution 2026-02, calling and giving notice of the holding of a general municipal election for the purpose of electing a Mayor for the full term of two years, and one member of the City Council from District 2 and one member of the City Council from District 4 for the full term of four years; and

WHEREAS, as of the close of the nomination period for the office of Mayor on Friday, March 6, 2026, only one person had been nominated and filed nomination papers to run for the office of Mayor; and

WHEREAS, as of the close of the nomination period for the office of Councilmember, District 2 on Friday, March 6, 2026, only one person had been nominated and filed nomination papers to run for the office of Councilmember, District 2; and

WHEREAS, as of the close of the nomination period for the office of Councilmember, District 4 on Friday, March 6, 2026, only one person had been nominated and filed nomination papers to run for the office of Councilmember, District 4; and

WHEREAS, because of the above facts, Section 10229 of the California Elections Code allows the City Council to take one of the following courses of action for each office:

1. Appoint to the office the person who has been nominated, or
2. Hold the election for the office.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10229 of the California Elections Code, a notice, attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit A, was published on March 11, 2026, in the Inland Valley Daily Bulletin, providing notice of these facts and the courses of action available to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10229 of the California Elections Code, if by the 75th day before the scheduled General Municipal Election (March 19, 2026), no person has been appointed an office pursuant to (1) above, then the election for that office must be held; and

WHEREAS, if the City Council makes an appointment pursuant to Section 10229 of the California Elections Code, the City Clerk / Elections Official shall not accept for filing any statement of write-in candidacy for that office which is submitted after the appointment is made; and

WHEREAS, all other legal prerequisites to the adoption of this Resolution have occurred.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIMAS DOES
HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION 1. The above recitals are true and correct.

SECTION 2. Pursuant to Section 10229 of the California Elections Code, the following action is taken:

The following persons are appointed to the office to which each was nominated, and are considered the same as being elected, pursuant to Section 10229(a)(1) of the California Elections Code:


NAME	OFFICE	TERM
Emmett G. Badar	Mayor	Full two-year term
Eric Nakano	Councilmember, District 2	Full four-year term
Ryan A. Vienna	Councilmember, District 4	Full four-year term

SECTION 3. Pursuant to Elections Code Section 10229, the election scheduled to be held on June 2, 2026, to elect a candidate for Mayor, a candidate for Councilmember, District 2, and a candidate for Councilmember, District 4, is hereby cancelled because the City Council has made the above appointments.

SECTION 4. The persons appointed shall qualify and take office and serve exactly as if elected at the General Municipal Election for the office.

SECTION 5. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and so notify the Los Angeles County Chief Elections Officer of the City Council's action.

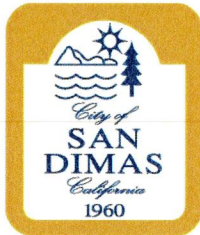

**NOTICE THAT ONLY ONE PERSON HAS BEEN
NOMINATED FOR EACH OF THE OFFICES OF MAYOR,
CITY COUNCILMEMBER FOR DISTRICT 2, AND CITY
COUNCILMEMBER FOR DISTRICT 4
AT THE JUNE 2, 2026, GENERAL MUNICIPAL
ELECTION FOR THE CITY OF SAN DIMAS**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that pursuant to Section 10229 of the Elections Code of the State of California relating to the General Municipal Election in the City of San Dimas to be held on Tuesday, June 2, 2026:

As of the close of the nomination period on March 6, 2026, only one person has been nominated for the office of Mayor, one person for Councilmember, District 2, and one person for Councilmember, District 4.

The nominated people are Emmett G. Badar for Mayor, Eric Nakano for Councilmember, District 2, and Ryan A. Vienna for Councilmember, District 4.

That Section 10229 of the Elections Code allows one of the following courses of action to be taken by the City Council for each of the elections of Mayor, District 2 Councilmember, and District 4 Councilmember:

1. Appoint to the office the person who has been nominated.
2. Appoint to the office any eligible elector (voter) if no one has been nominated.
3. Hold the election if either no one or only one person has been nominated.

The City Council will meet on March 18, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. at the City of San Dimas Council Chamber, 245 East Bonita Avenue, San Dimas CA, to either make the appointment or direct an election to be held, for each office. The persons appointed, if any, shall qualify and take office and serve exactly as if elected at a municipal election for the office.

If, by the 75th day before the municipal election, no person has been appointed to the office of Mayor, Councilmember District 2, or Councilmember District 4 pursuant to (1) or (2) above, then the election for the unappointed office or offices shall be held.

If the City Council makes an appointment pursuant to Section 10229, Elections Code, the City Clerk shall not accept for filing any statement of write-in candidacy which is submitted after the appointment is made.
